What will I study?



COURSE STRUCTURE

Module 1 + 2

Topic : PHOTOGRAPHERS EYE PROJECT / GUIDED PROJECT

- You will be introduced to how the formal elements are used in photography.
- You will explore the technical nature of a digital camera.
- You will discover the importance of controlling light in photography.
- You will explore both digital and chemical photography.
- You will begin to think critically about the work of other photographers/artist.
- You will explore how to edit photographs both digitally and manually.
- You will begin to develop a visual language for photographer/artist appreciation and analysing art work.
- This is an opportunity for you to begin to present a personal response.

Module 3 + 4

Topic : PERSONAL INVESTIGATION - 60% of your final mark.

- This is an opportunity for you to develop your own digital slideshow of creative work and final pieces.
- You will begin to write a critical essay linked to your practical work using visual and analytical language.
- You will begin to apply your knowledge of all aspects of photography which you will have deepened in module 1 and 2.
- You will demonstrate how you are improving and refining your skills in all aspects of photography.
- You will be able to develop a meaningful and personal body of photographs.

Module 5 + 6

Topic : EXAMINATION UNIT - 40% of your final mark.

- You will develop your ideas through investigations in response to a chosen exam question.
- You will be given the opportunity to develop and refine your work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.
- You will record ideas, observations and insights relevant to your chosen exam question.
- This is an opportunity for you to present a deeply personal and meaningful series of photographs.



What skills will I develop?

Photography has a very broad scope for you to specialise in various forms of photography which you feel are interesting or suitable to you such as digital photography, chemical photography, film, collage, sound, drawing using photography. In Module 1 & 2 the course will be more teacher-led to give you an opportunity to experiment with a series of chosen techniques and research selected key artists. This will be to help you to experience and develop a set of skills in response to techniques and processes you may not have used before. Throughout Module 3, 4, 5 & 6 you will be able to tailor this knowledge and experience to your own interests providing that you are meeting the Assessment Objectives provided by the exam board. There are some examples of the fantastic artwork that students have previously made on the following slides.

What enrichment opportunities will there be?

Previously we have visited a range of art venues as an opportunity for students to build on their own artwork. Venues include; Tate Modern – London, The National Gallery – London, The National Portrait Gallery – London, Baltic Gateshead, The Laing – Newcastle, The Side Gallery – Newcastle, The Shipley Gallery – Gateshead, The Scottish Museum of Modern Art – Edinburgh, The Scottish National Gallery – Edinburgh, The Scottish National Portrait Gallery – Edinburgh. We have also organised a range of photography trips to local natural and urban areas give students the opportunity to photograph specific landscapes.

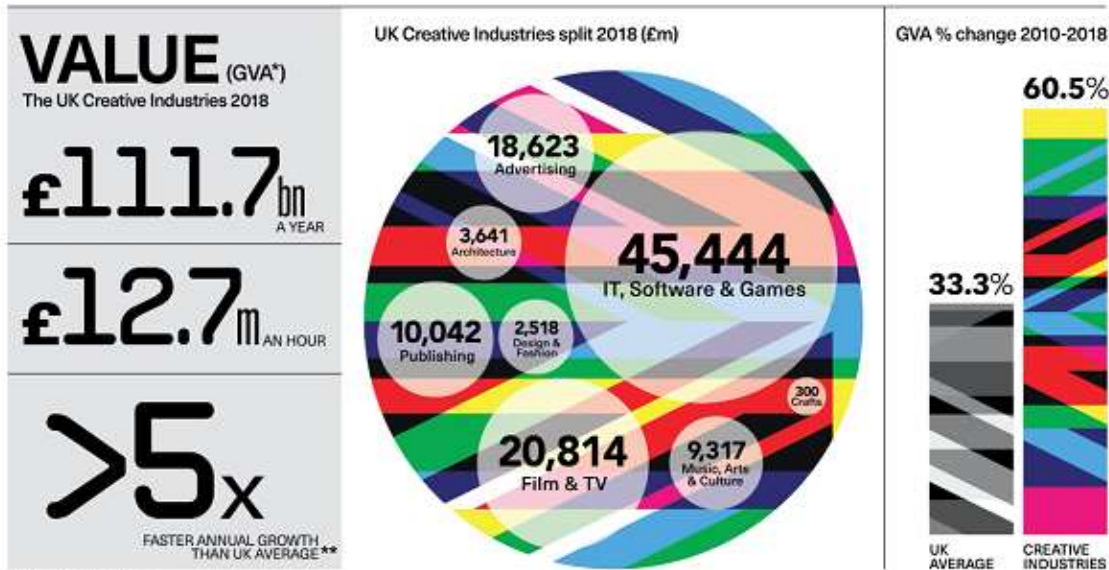
Why should I study Photography?

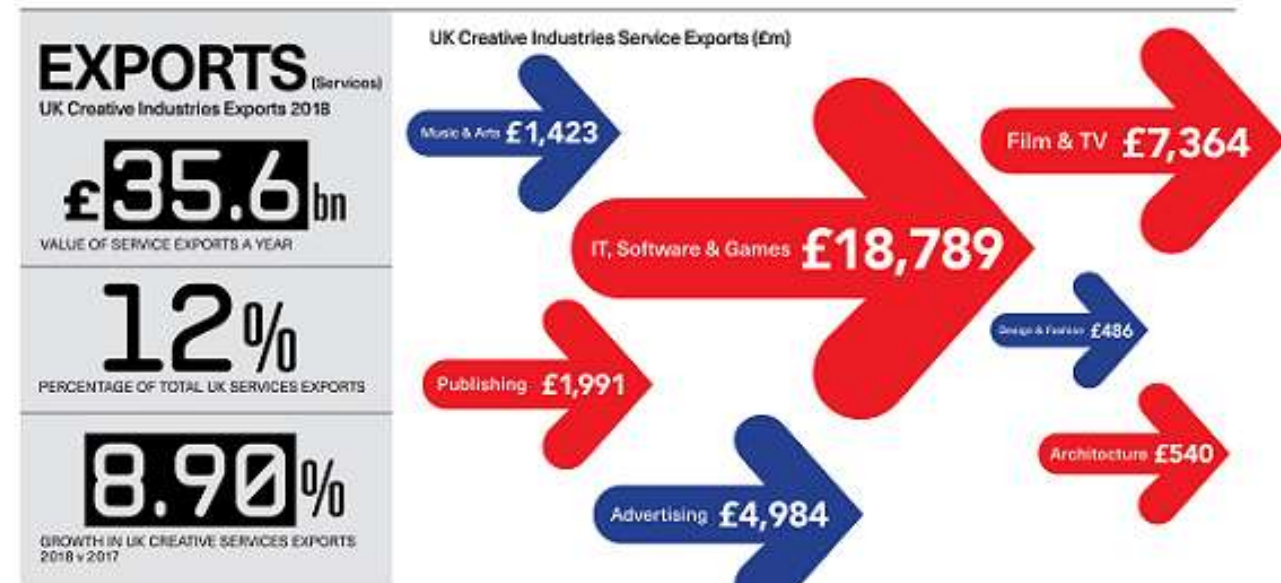
The UK Creative Industries

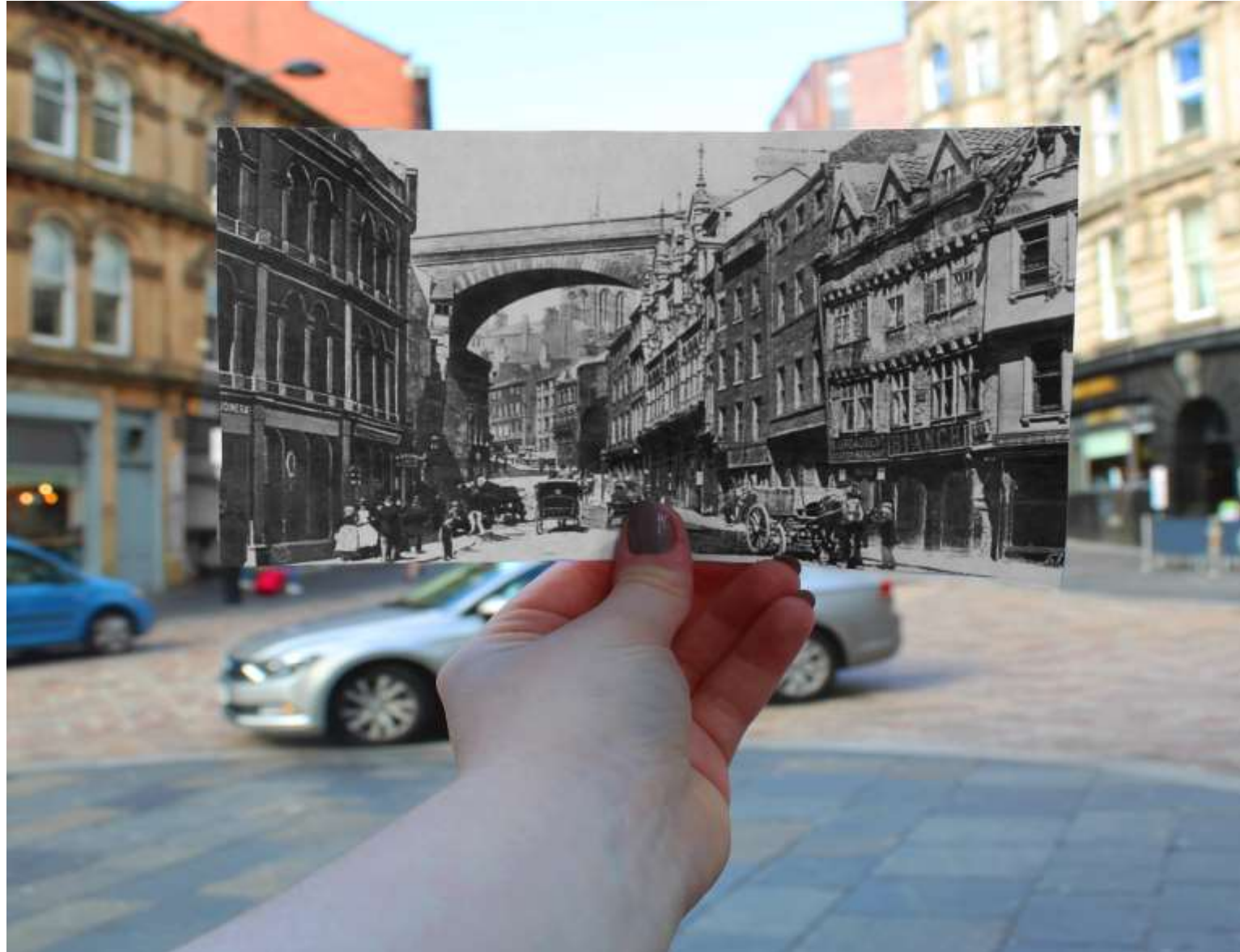

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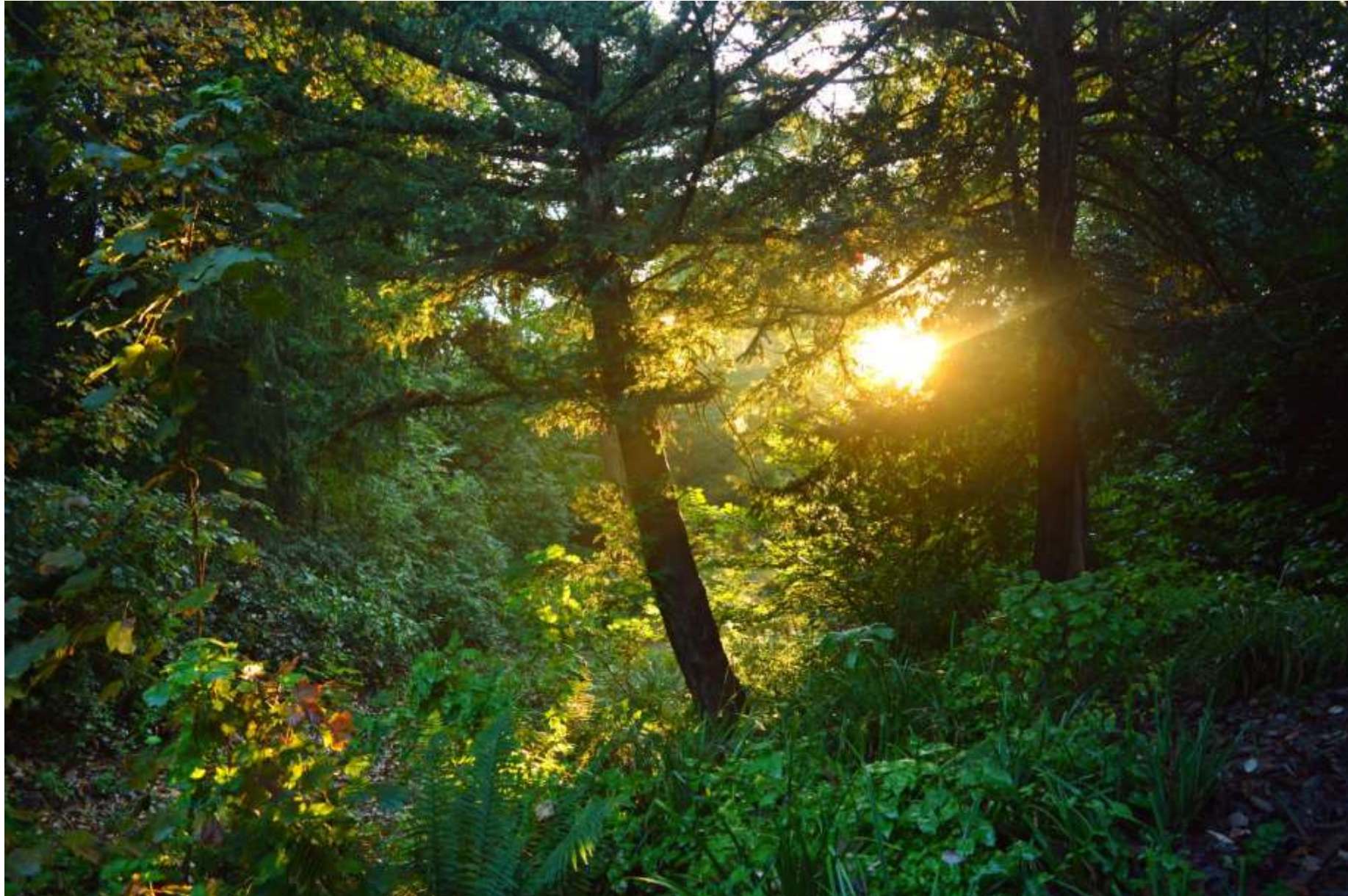
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
