Dear Parents/Carers,

We are really looking forward to welcoming your child back to school and to working with them, but obviously the landscape of the school continues to be different due to the Covid – 19 Pandemic.

I wish to once again reassure you that our staff have been tirelessly preparing over the past two weeks for re-opening to all pupils to ensure that our plans are in accordance with the latest secondary school specific guidance. The school has produced detailed risk assessments to mitigate against the transmission of the virus, in line with DfE and public health guidance.

To ensure that parents and students are fully informed prior to Monday March 8th, we have produced a summary document which is attached.

It is vital that you read the accompanying documentation and that you revisit these procedures with your child to ensure that they fully understand the necessary changes we have had to make to secure the safest of environments for all.

The most significant change that your child will experience since Christmas will be the introduction of face coverings. Initially, until the Easter break, pupils will be required to wear their face mask in lessons, unless medically exempt. Face coverings must be completely plain in design and unbranded. Disposable white/blue masks are also permitted, but we discourage their use for environmental reasons.

Uniform and Hairstyles

We are very proud of the excellent standards of appearance of our pupils. Pupils are already aware of our high expectations in relation to uniform, as well as the hairstyles accepted in the school. There are no changes to these expectations from 8th March and we expect everyone to adhere to these high standards on their return to school.

Equipment

It is important that pupils are well organised and have the equipment they need to learn. We would like all pupils to ensure they are fully equipped.

Equipment List:

- School planner (provided by school in September)
- Blue or black biro/writing pen (+ Spare)
- Green biro/writing pen (+Spare)

**Parents/Carers: Stay Alert. Keep your child at home if they have Covid-19 symptoms.
Stay Safe.**

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- Ruler, rubber and sharpener
- Glue stick
- Calculator
- Reading book (for those year groups expected to have them as before)
- Reusable water bottle, filled before leaving home

Hygiene Equipment

Pupils are encouraged to bring their own supplies of the following (we will have supplies in school too):

- Hand sanitiser
- Surface wipes
- Tissues
- Plain unbranded face covering (+Spare in resealable bag)

Pupils will be permitted to use them at the start of lessons and during break/lunch, under the supervision of adults.

Covid Symptoms

If students have any of the following COVID-19 symptoms or have tested positive in the last 10 days, they must stay at home and parents should contact school to let us know.

COVID-19 symptoms:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- new loss of taste or smell (anosmia)

We are really looking forward to welcoming our students back to the school. Thank you for all you have done to support them in their remote learning and for your support of the school.

STUDENT PROTOCOLS MARCH 2021 YEAR 7 - 11

How we will make school safe:

Safety measures to reduce the risk of transmission and based on government guidance for schools.

Bubbles

- School will be divided into a number of 'Bubbles'.
- Students will be divided into Bubbles based on their Year group. For example, Year 7 will be a Bubble.
- Sixth-Form students will be operating within a Sixth-Form Bubble in a self-contained building with its own student entrance and exit.
- The Bubble structure will help to reduce the number of people students and staff are with, helping to keep them safe.
- Each Bubble will work in a small section of the school. They will have a designated entrance and exit, handwashing stations, toilets and classrooms.
- As far as possible Bubbles will be self-contained and students will not travel to other parts of the building into other Bubbles except where absolutely necessary for example, to access IT suites.
- Where more than one Bubble might be accessing a location, enhanced cleaning will take place in between any changeover.
- To allow delivery of a broad curriculum and effective pastoral support, staff will be able to move across Bubbles but will follow strict hygiene protocols and maintain a distance of 2m from students (and other staff).

Hygiene and cleanliness

- Students and staff will sanitise their hands upon entrance to, and exit, from the building as well as regular hand sanitising throughout the school day in-line with government guidance.
- Classrooms, stairwells and doors will be cleaned on a daily basis.
- We are also introducing additional cleaning methods in high-use areas to enhance hygiene.
- Enhanced cleaning of toilets will take place throughout the day.
- Students will be provided with tissues and be encouraged to 'catch it, kill it, bin it'.
- Classroom doors and windows will be open, where possible, to aid ventilation.
- All students will be issued with a Student Planner and we would ask parents/carers to sign these weekly as usual but in order to reduce contact Tutors will not be signing planners.
- The transfer of work into/out of school will be kept to a minimum and homework will be set on Google Classroom, this will help reduce potential transmission points.

<p><u>Travel to and from school</u></p> <p><i>The government is asking parents that wherever possible students walk or cycle to school.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are asking parents to discuss with their child observing social distancing as they make their way to and from school. • Student drop-off is in a designated area: car park 1. • Parents must stay in their car. • If you are dropping off / collecting your child on foot, you must remain at the school gates, and cannot enter the school site. • Current advice is when using public transport students must wear a face covering and should minimise the surfaces they touch but this must be removed prior to entering the school building. The face covering must be disposed of or placed in a sealable plastic bag (provided by parents) before entering the site. • Students should not congregate outside of school. <p><i>Please be aware that public transport may be running at reduced capacity and, in addition, at the time of school producing this document the government has informed schools further guidance regarding transport will be produced for Local Authorities.</i></p>	<p><u>Entrance to school</u></p> <p>Students to be on site <u>no earlier than 8:30am</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Please see Bubble entrance / exit information table below, which details where students should go when they arrive at school. • Students will be greeted by staff and instructed when they can enter the building. • Students will sanitise their hands on entrance into the building. • Where possible, social distancing rules will be followed. • Clear signage will remind students about hygiene and social distancing. • If students arrive late to school they must go to the Visitor Reception where staff will support them with entering their Bubble location.

<p><u>Break and Lunch time</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KS3 and KS4 breaks and lunch times will be staggered. • Bubbles will have separate outside spaces. • Bubbles will have separate eating spaces. • Students will be issued with a card to pay for items using a contactless system. ParentPay should be used to add money to your child's account. If you do not currently have a ParentPay account, please contact the school office on office@stjosephs.uk.net • Students can bring a packed lunch into school. • Wherever possible, staff on duty will maintain a 2m distance from students. 	<p><u>Moving around school</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When moving around the school, students will be asked to follow staff instructions and leave the room when told to do so. • A one-way system will be in place to reduce contact.
<p><u>Uniform</u></p> <p>Government guidance encourages all schools to 'return to their usual uniform policies'.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our uniform policy and expectations regarding uniform remain as usual. • As per government guidance masks will now be worn in class by students. • Uniforms do not need to be cleaned any more often than usual, nor do they need to be cleaned using methods which are different from normal. • A copy of our uniform policy and expectations regarding uniform can be found on our website: http://www.stjosephs.uk.net/wp-content/uploads/2019/07/Uniform-Policy.pdf • The Headteacher's decision regarding suitable uniform and whether school expectations have been met is final. If a student's appearance does not meet the expected standard, the school reserves the right to apply sanctions in line with our behaviour policy. <p>We ask parents to read our uniform policy and thank you in advance for your continued support in ensuring our high expectations regarding uniform are maintained.</p> <p><u>On a day when students have a timetabled P.E. lesson:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In order to reduce contact students are not going to be able to access the changing rooms. • Therefore, students will need to arrive at school wearing their P.E. kit and trainers. 	

- Students may choose to wear a dark coloured **non-branded** hoody and/or leggings/ tracksuit bottoms but **must wear their school blazer** in order to clearly identify students as being part of our school community and this therefore **directly supports safeguarding**.

UNIFORM WORN CORRECTLY

Students who fail to wear uniform correctly will be dealt with according to the school's Behaviour Policy. The statutory guidance on uniform from the Department for Education states:

“Teachers can discipline pupils for breaching the school's rules on appearance or uniform. This should be carried out in accordance with the school's published behaviour policy.

A headteacher, or a person authorised by the head teacher, may ask a pupil to go home briefly to remedy a breach of the school's rules on appearance or uniform. When making this decision schools need to consider the child's age and vulnerability, the ease and time it will take, and the availability of the child's parents. This is not an exclusion but an authorised absence. However, if the pupil continues to breach uniform rules in such a way as to be sent home to avoid school, or takes longer than is strictly necessary to effect the change, the pupil's absence may be counted as an unauthorised absence. In either case the pupil's parents must be notified and the absence should be recorded. If a school is considering excluding a pupil in response to breaches of uniform policy then this must be in line with the legal requirements for exclusion.”

Equipment

- Students will require the usual school equipment which should not be shared with other students.
- The equipment required is: black/blue pen (and a spare); green pen; pencil; ruler; Glue Stick; calculator (Casio FX83) and a school bag. **No calculators can be loaned out.**
- All KS3 students should have a reading book with them at all times.
- Where students will need to access other equipment supplied by school (for example subject specific equipment) this will only be used by students within a Bubble.
- Where equipment supplied by school needs to be used by students in different Bubbles it will be cleaned before use in-line with government guidance.
- Students should bring a filled water bottle to school. **For hygiene purposes water machines will be unavailable and therefore students will be unable to refill their bottle at any time.** Bottles of water can be purchased at lunch time.
- Pupils should attend school with a **durable mask** (and spare) as per government guidelines

Behaviour expectations

These are **exactly the same** as usual, here are some reminders:

- Be respectful of each other and all staff.
- Follow instructions as soon as you are asked to do so.
- Mobile phones should be switched off /silent.
- If you feel worried or have any questions: tell a teacher and we will help you.

Please be aware that the Behaviour Policy has been recently updated to include a COVID-19 addendum that clearly states our expectation that all students adhere to the COVID-19 Student Protocols i.e. this document.

The updated Behaviour Policy can be found on our school website in the Policies section.

First Aid

- A First Aider is on site.
- If students start to feel unwell during the day, they need to let their teacher know.
- If a student starts to develop COVID-19 symptoms during the day staff will follow the appropriate protocol to isolate the student in order to reduce risk to others.
- There will be designated isolation space within school for use in the event a student or member of staff begins to develop COVID-19 symptoms during the day.
- Where a student falls ill during the school day with COVID-19 symptoms school will immediately contact parents and the **student will need to be collected as soon as possible.**
- Where a student is sent home with COVID-19 symptoms they must self-isolate for 10 days and should arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus. Other members of the household (**including any siblings**) should self-isolate for 10 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms.
- Where the symptomatic person tests negative other members of the household can stop self-isolating.

End of School Day

Students will be expected to:

- Follow staff instructions and leave the room when told to do so.
- Sanitise hands on exit of the building.
- Leave the school site straight away, unless attending a directed after-school intervention or extra-curricular club or activity.
- Students should not congregate outside of school.
- Parents are requested to pick their children up from the designated area: car park 1.
- Parents **must** stay in their car.
- If you are collecting your child on foot you must remain at the gate and not enter the school site.

Visitors to School:

School will be closed to all external visitors including parents, other than the emergency services, social workers or professionals from external agencies. **Parents cannot enter the school building.** If you need to speak to a member of staff, please telephone or email school.

If you are collecting your child during the school day:

Please ring reception once you arrive on site to alert staff you are on the school site (at gate/ car park).

It is important that parents are aware that teachers are in the position of parents/carers whilst students are in school. It is essential students follow the Student Protocol and our Behaviour Policy to ensure the safety of students, staff and their families. Please ensure you have sat with your child and read through our Student Protocol and Behaviour Policy with them prior to them returning to school in September.

If at any time students fail to follow the Student Protocol or acts in a manner that jeopardises the culture of the school or the safety of others, they will be required to be collected immediately.

If your child is unwell or we need to contact you regarding behaviour it is vital school has the correct contact details and those of two other emergency contacts. Please make sure that your contact details are up-to-date and where you might be unavailable due to work, you have provided the contact details of another trusted adult. Remote Learning Work

If school/the local area goes into lockdown:

- Online remote learning work and assessment will be initiated immediately.
- Students should follow their daily timetable to complete the work set on Google Classroom or attend any lessons scheduled on Teams.
- If a student is unable to return to school in September, then they will be given immediate access to remote home learning.
- Home study work is not an optional activity; students not attending school will be required to follow the work set.
- Work will focus on consolidating, reinforcing and reviewing key knowledge and skills as well as introducing new curriculum content.
- Work will also continue to prioritise student emotional wellbeing.

NHS Test and Trace

Staff and parents/carers will need to be ready and willing to:

- book a test if they are displaying symptoms. Staff and pupils must not come into the school if they have symptoms, and must be sent home to self-isolate if they develop them in school. All pupils can be tested, including pupils under 5, but pupils aged 11 and under will need to be helped by their parents/carers if using a home testing kit
- provide details of anyone they have been in close contact with if they were to test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or if asked by NHS Test & Trace
- self-isolate if they have been in close contact with someone who develops coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms or someone who tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19)

Anyone who displays symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) can and should get a test. Tests can be booked online through the NHS testing and tracing for coronavirus website, or ordered by telephone via NHS 119 for those without access to the internet. Essential workers, which includes anyone involved in education or childcare, have priority access to testing.

Parents and staff to inform the Academy immediately of the results of a test:

- if someone tests negative, if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating. They could still have another virus, such as a cold or flu – in which case it is still best to avoid contact with other people until they are better. Other members of their household can stop self-isolating.
- if someone tests positive, they should follow the 'stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection' and must continue to self-isolate for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste. This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone. The 10-day period starts from the day when they first became ill. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating

until their temperature returns to normal. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 10 days.

On Site Testing

Rapid testing using Lateral Flow Devices (LFD)s will support the return to face-to-face education by helping to identify people who are infectious but do not have any coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms. For secondary school staff and pupils, we are moving to a home testing model (for pupils, following the first 3 onsite tests). The lateral flow devices used have received regulatory approval from the MHRA for self-use. Once pupils have been tested 3 times at school, they will be provided with home test kits for regular testing. Testing remains voluntary but strongly encouraged.

Home Testing

Video Guide on how to Home test

Pupils will be given their home testing kit when they take their 3rd test in school (Week Beginning 15th of March.) Testing should be carried out at home from Sunday the 21st of March, every Sunday evening and Wednesday. Staff and pupils must report their result to NHS Test and Trace as soon as the test is completed either online or by telephone as per the instructions in the home test kit.

Pupils aged 18 and over should self-test and report the result, with assistance if needed.

Adolescents aged 12 to 17 should self-test and report with adult supervision. The adult may conduct the test if necessary.

Children aged 11 should be tested by an adult.

Parents and staff to inform the Academy immediately with the results of a test:

Staff and pupils should also share their result, whether void, positive or negative, with their school electronically to help with contact tracing – further details on how to do this will be shared with all parents/pupils WB 8th of March

Staff or pupils with a positive LFD test result will need to self-isolate in line with the stay-at-home guidance – 10 Days.

They must also need to arrange a lab-based polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result if the test was done at home. Those with a negative LFD test result can continue to attend school.

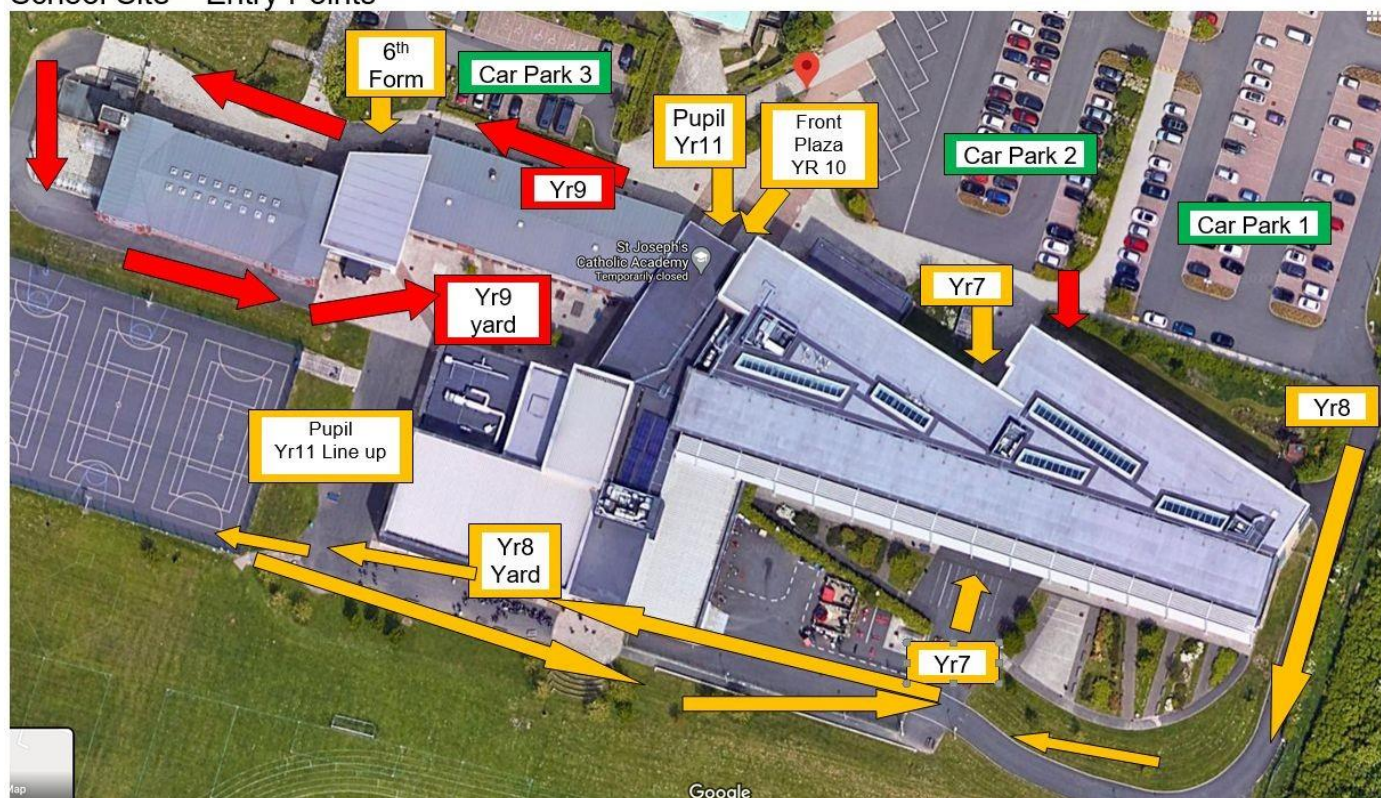


Table of information about Bubble entrance / exits:

All Pupils will line up in tutor groups prior to being escorted to their form classes. This allows for reinforcement of protocols and hand sanitising.

- Students can bring packed lunch into school.
- Social distancing rules must be followed during lunch time
- Students will be issued with a card to pay for items using a contactless system. ParentPay should be used to add money to your child's account. **If you do not currently have a ParentPay account, please contact the school office on office@stjosephs.uk.net**

First Aid

- A First Aider is on site.
- If students start to feel unwell during the day, they need to let their teacher know.
- If a student starts to develop COVID-19 symptoms during the day staff will follow the appropriate protocol to isolate the student in order to reduce risk to others.
- There will be designated isolation space within school for use in the event a student or member of staff begins to develop COVID-19 symptoms during the day.
- Where a student falls ill during the school day with COVID-19 symptoms school will immediately contact parents and the **student will need to be collected as soon as possible.**
- Where a student is sent home with COVID-19 symptoms they must self-isolate for 10 days and should arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus. Other members of the household (**including any siblings**) should self-isolate for 10 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms.
- Where the symptomatic person tests negative other members of the household can stop self-isolating.

Uniform and Equipment

- Equipment will not be shared.
- Where students will need to access other equipment supplied by school (for example subject specific equipment) this will only be used by students within a Bubble.
- Where equipment supplied by school needs to be used by students in different Bubbles it will be cleaned before use in-line with government guidance.
- Students should bring a filled water bottle to school. **For hygiene purposes water machines will be unavailable and therefore students will be unable to refill their bottle at any time.** Bottles of water can be purchased at lunch time.
- Hand gel is available in every classroom.
- Students will have use of their locker to store files
- Students can bring in files equipment in a bag.
- Mobile phones as directed by staff
- Our uniform policy and expectations regarding uniform remain as usual.
- Uniforms do not need to be cleaned any more often than usual, nor do they need to be cleaned using methods which are different from normal.
- **Following recent guidance students will not be permitted to wear face coverings anywhere on the school site.**

End of School Day

Students will be expected to:

- Follow staff instructions and leave room when told to do so.
- Follow social distancing rules at all times.
- Wash hands on exit of the building.
- Leave the school site straight away. Do not stay at the school exit waiting for friends.
- Students should not travel in groups from school.
- Students should not congregate outside of school.
- Parents are requested to pick their children up from the collection area car park next to D block.
- Parents must stay in their car.
- If you are collecting your child on foot you must remain at the gate and not enter the school site.

Remote Learning Work

If school/the local area goes into lockdown:

- Remote learning work and assessment will be initiated immediately.
- Students should follow their daily timetable to complete the work set on Google Classroom or attend live lessons on Teams.
- If a student is unable to return to school in September, then they will be given immediate access to remote home learning.
- Home study work is not an optional activity; students not attending school will be required to follow the work set.
- Work will focus on consolidating, reinforcing and reviewing key knowledge and skills as well as introducing new curriculum content.
- Work will also continue to prioritise student emotional wellbeing.

NHS Test and Trace

Staff and parents/carers will need to be ready and willing to:

- book a test if they are displaying symptoms. Staff and pupils must not come into the school if they have symptoms, and must be sent home to self-isolate if they develop them in school. All pupils can be tested, including pupils under 5, but pupils aged 11 and under will need to be helped by their parents/carers if using a home testing kit
- provide details of anyone they have been in close contact with if they were to test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or if asked by NHS Test & Trace
- self-isolate if they have been in close contact with someone who develops coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms or someone who tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19)

Anyone who displays symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) can and should get a test. Tests can be booked online through the NHS testing and tracing for coronavirus website, or ordered by telephone via NHS 119 for those without access to the internet. Essential workers, which includes anyone involved in education or childcare, have priority access to testing.

Parents and staff to inform the Academy immediately of the results of a test:

- if someone tests negative, if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating. They could still have another virus, such as a cold or flu – in which case it is still best to avoid contact with other people until they are better. Other members of their household can stop self-isolating.
- if someone tests positive, they should follow the ‘stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection’ and must continue to self-isolate for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste. This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone. The 10-day period starts from the day when they first became ill. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating until their temperature returns to normal. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 10 days.

On Site Testing

Rapid testing using Lateral Flow Devices (LFD)s will support the return to face-to-face education by helping to identify people who are infectious but do not have any coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms.

For secondary school staff and pupils we are moving to a home testing model (for pupils, following the first 3 onsite tests). The lateral flow devices used have received regulatory approval from the MHRA for self-use. Once pupils have been tested 3 times at school, they will be provided with home test kits for regular testing. Testing remains voluntary but strongly encouraged.

Pupils will be given their home testing kit when they take their 3rd test in school (Week Beginning 15th of March.) Testing should be carried out at home from Sunday the 21st of March, every Sunday evening and Wednesday. Staff and pupils must report their result to NHS Test and Trace as soon as the test is completed either online or by telephone as per the instructions in the home test kit.

Pupils aged 18 and over should self-test and report the result, with assistance if needed.

Adolescents aged 12 to 17 should self-test and report with adult supervision. The adult may conduct the test if necessary.

Parents and staff to inform the Academy immediately with the results of a test:

Staff and pupils should also share their result, whether void, positive or negative, with their school electronically to help with contact tracing – further details on how to do this will be shared with all parents/pupils WB 8th of March

Staff or pupils with a positive LFD test result will need to self-isolate in line with the stay-at-home guidance – 10 Days.

They must also need to arrange a lab-based polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result if the test was done at home. Those with a negative LFD test result can continue to attend school.
